During that week, the state hosts Show-Me Green Sales Tax Holiday and is waiving its sales tax on the first \$1,500 of items such as washing machines, refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, water heaters, furnaces and air conditioners if the new appliance is Energy Star-certified. Funny Money Facts

Even though mobile and electronic payment methods becoming the norm, it seems coins and currency notes still aren't disappearing. Did you know?

It costs approximately 2.4¢ to manufacture a penny.

As of March 31, 2018 there was about \$1,600,000,000,000 in U.S. currency in circulation.

The Bureau of Engraving and Printing makes 38 million notes a day, with about 45% of the notes being \$1 bills.
